Purpose:

- Residents' Rights handouts and Ombudsman brochures
- Posters with Resident quotes about Residents' Rights
- Sign in sheet (collect emails so you can keep in contact).
- Podium and Microphone for presentation

Additions or Modifications:

1. Have an Elder Services Open House with various agencies that work with Elders represented.
