Dear Speaker Pelosi and Leader McCarthy,

The undersigned organizations urge you to ensure that important protections for nursing home residents are included in the Budget Reconciliation bill being considered by the House of Representatives. Considering the great tragedy that befell nursing home residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, now more than ever we must address the long-standing issues in facilities that have been barriers to the provision of quality care.

The Budget Reconciliation bill, as passed out of the Budget Committee, currently includes provisions that, if passed, would make a significant difference in the lives of nursing home residents. These provisions¹ (Title XIII, Subtitle E, Part 3, Secs. 134301-134304) address funding that improves the accuracy and reliability of certain skilled nursing facility data; ensures accurate information on Medicare cost reports; provides necessary funds to improve the survey and oversight process; and addresses insufficient staffing by providing a necessary path towards achieving minimum staffing standards. Research shows that the presence of sufficient staff lowers infections, leads to better outcomes and fewer deaths for residents.

More than 186,000² residents and staff in long-term care facilities died of COVID-19. We must take action now to protect and support those living and working in long-term care facilities and prevent such a tragedy from recurring in the future. These provisions in the Budget Reconciliation bill are a critical step in the right direction.
