In the FAQs, OCR clarified that federal civil rights laws apply to:

- Health care providers, including those administering COVID-19 testing, medical supplies, and medication.
- Entities providing hospitalization, long-term care, intensive treatments, and

critical care, such as oxygen therapy and mechanical ventilators.

• State Crisis Standard of Care plans, procedures, and related standards for triaging scarce resources that hospitals are required to follow.
