

## Alice Hedt to Testify at May 2 Hearing On the Nursing Home Reform Act

The Senate Special Committee on Aging, chaired by Senator Herb Kohl (D-WI), will hold an oversight hearing Wednesday, May 2, titled “The Nursing Home Reform Act Turns Twenty: What Has Been Accomplished, and What Challenges Remain?” NCCNHR Executive Director Alice Hedt will testify.

NCCNHR has encouraged several congressional committees to hold hearings to review progress and problems in the decades since the law was passed, and this is the first to be held.

The first witness will be Kathryn Allen, Director of Health Care Issues at the Government Accountability Office, describing the findings from the just-released GAO report on federal enforcement. Also testifying will be Charlene Harrington, who has frequently presented her research on nurse staffing and enforcement at NCCNHR annual meetings. She was a member of the Institute of Medicine study committee whose 1986 recommendations on nursing home regulation paved the way for passage of the law.
